VACCINES

- **CORE**—every year!
 - **Clostridial diseases**
 - Enterotoxemia
 - *Clostridium perfringens* C & D
 - Tetanus
 - *Clostridium tetani*
- **OPTIONAL**—based on disease problems and environment or special requirements
 - **Vibriosis**
 - Breeding females; autogenous bacterins may be better!
 - **Caseous lymphadenitis**
 - *Corynebacterium pseudotuberculosis*
 - Controversial vaccine--leads to “false positive animals”
 - One vaccine approved for each species
 - **Bluetongue**
 - USDA approved vaccine does not contain the strain of bluetongue virus common in Idaho
 - **Contagious ecthyma** (sore mouth, orf)
 - **Chlamydiosis**
 - Controversial vaccine
 - Breeding females and males; 1 mo. Pre breeding
 - **Pasteurellosis**

NOTES AND PRECAUTIONS

- All approved vaccines for sheep and goats require two doses 2-4 wks apart for primary immunization followed by yearly boosters.
- (Re-)vaccinate all purchases and isolate ALL new additions from the home herd for a minimum of 15 days.
- **Always consult with your veterinarian before adopting or changing a vaccination program**
- **ALWAYS VACCINATE ACCORDING TO LABEL DIRECTIONS.**
