Accidents Happen, But What To Do Next

Of course, the best thing to do is prevent accidents. We always encourage everyone to be vigilant in planning and preparing for meetings. Thinking through possible accidents and how to prevent them is always best. From our Area 4-H Youth Development Educator, Nancy Shelstad, here are some things to think about:

- Is the facility safe and appropriate for the planned activity?
- Do all the people involved know the ground rules of the event (possibly no horsing around, staying out of the arena, etc.)?
- Do parents stay at the event?
- Is there an appropriate amount of supervision?
- Do all the 4-H volunteers know what to do in case of emergency?
- Is there a first aid kit available?

If an accident happens at a club meeting, first secure the area and stop all activity. Address any medical needs and assess whether the meeting should continue or end for the day. The Extension office needs to know as soon as possible so that we can fill out appropriate paperwork. Canyon County 4-H takes out accident insurance on all active, enrolled 4-H members and volunteers.

The Extension office is here to help you and advise you in any way we can. We are happy to talk through any scenarios and help with an emergency plan for your club. In addition, if your club is planning an activity that involves those not enrolled in 4-H, we can help with appropriate paperwork and accident insurance.

- Be at least 21 years of age (18 years for assistant instructors)
- Be screened, trained and appointed as a current 4-H volunteer through their local County Extension
 Office
- Successfully complete instructor discipline training administered/sanctioned through the University of Idaho 4-H Youth Development Office
- Be trained and certified in any discipline(s) that they are teaching at the county level
- Participants must attend the entire training and successfully complete all aspects to receive their respective discipline certification

2024 Canyon County Fair Market Tag and Declaration Information

In 2024, all market species and horses will complete declarations through an online process. Please note that the declaration process is separate from your fair entry. Declaration due dates are scheduled by species and listed below. Declarations are not required for breeding animals and small animals.

Prior to tags being available participants will need to be enrolled in correct market project in Zsuite. Members will need to reserve tags by midnight the night before at <u>canyoncountyfair.org</u>. Tags should be placed in the animals left ear (when you stand over the animal).



THERE ARE NO IN-PERSON WEIGH-INS FOR ANY SPECIES. Tags will be available as follows:


