Many Canyon County 4-H members participate in market animal projects each year. This year during project interviews, interviewers told me that quite a few youth were confused by the three production metrics they had been asked to do in their record books. More importantly, these youth were confused why this was important. So, let's review these, why they are important, why you should look at the actual figures for the year, and what it means for next year.

<u>Profit/Loss</u> – This is probably the most straightforward of all the math equations in your book: Total Income – Total Expenses = Profit (or loss). Maybe you compared real life market prices for your book and maybe you looked at last year's 4-H/FFA Market Sale prices, but I encourage youth to now look at what they received from the 2024 sale. Hopefully it is a profit, but if it is not or not enough of a profit, now is the time to see where you can cut costs and/or how you can recruit buyers/add-ons in 2025. What was your largest expense? Can that cost be cut? Talk to your leader, do some research, and call the Extension office. We are all here to help.

Average Daily Gain (ADG) – Average Daily Gain is one of the most common market metrics used to calculate how efficient your animal is. ADG is calculated by: Total pounds gained on Test (final weight at fair minus first weight at tagging or initial weigh-in) ÷ number of animals fed ÷ number of days on test (number of days from tagging or initial weigh-in to fair) = ADG. A higher number means a more efficient animal. Compare this to previous animals you have raised, to other animals in your club, and to market expectations for your species. From the Idaho 4-H Animal Science Lesson Plan on ADG, "Industry average for average daily gain (ADG) for each species is as follows: Beef 2.5 lbs/day, Swine 1.7 lbs/day, Sheep .5 lbs/day and Meat Goat .3lbs/day."

Feed Cost per Pound of Gain – Feed Cost per Pound of Gain is an efficiency metric that helps you see how cost effectively you are putting weight on your animal. It is calculated by: Total Feed Cost (a line in your Expense page) ÷ total pounds gained (same used in calculating ADG) = Feed Cost per Pound of Gain. The lower this number is, the more efficient your animal is. This can be tricky though, because you don't want to spend too much, but you also don't want to use cheap, low quality feed. Again, compare animals that you have raised in the past (remember inflation) and other animals in your club.

Of course, in 4-H, our first goal is to help young people develop into responsible leaders of tomorrow. In the meantime, we also want to give them the tools to succeed in business. Having discussions about the finances of their projects can help them understand business practices. Hopefully they also choose to also be the livestock producers of tomorrow and if so we want them be successful at it. So, it is important to review how the 2024 animals did while looking to improve in 2025.



Special County Medal Awards

Due Friday, September 27

4-H members have an opportunity to receive special recognition for the 2023/2024 4-H year by applying for a County Medal Award. 4-H members who received a blue ribbon on their Fair exhibit or a gold award on their interview evaluation, are eligible to apply. County Medals are available for all project areas.

County Medal Awards are designed to recognize outstanding achievement in a member's total 4-H experience, above and beyond the project level at the Fair. It takes into account the development of the youth in areas of goal setting, accomplishments, knowledge and skills gained, leadership and citizenship, communication and promotion. Some project areas can be combined at the discretion of the County Awards Committee.

Applications can be found through a link on the Friday email.

Application Requirements:

- Must have exhibited at the current county Fair.
- Must have received a blue ribbon or a gold medal on the project.
- Must have a 4-H Leader recommendation returned by September 27.
- Application must be returned by September 27.
- Award eligibility is based on a point system.
- The number of medals a 4-H member (by age category) can apply for are: Junior (2);
 Intermediate (4); and Senior (6).
- There is no limit to the number of times a member may be awarded the same County Medal.

Top 4-H Youth Leadership Awards

Due Friday, September 27

There are a number of awards that honor 4-H members for their outstanding overall contributions and abilities. Two of these awards are awarded in the fall: the **Idaho 4-H Key Award** and the **I Dare You Award**. Applications for these awards are due **September 27** to the Extension Office.

The **Idaho 4-H Key Award** gives recognition to 4-H members who have achieved significant leadership on both the club and county level. It is open to youth who have passed their 15th birthday by January 1 of the current year, have completed four years of 4-H work (including the current year) and have completed one year of teen leadership. The award is a gold key and a certificate. The wearer of the Idaho 4-H Key can be proud of his/her contribution to their club and community. Youth can complete an application found at the Canyon County Extension Office. Applications can be emailed on request.



The I Dare You Award gives recognition to 4-H members of excellent character, well-balanced personal development and demonstrated qualities of constructive leadership. Nominees must be either in their junior or senior year of school. Award recipients will receive a certificate and a copy of I Dare You! by William H Danforth. Award recipients are also eligible to apply for a scholarship to attend the National American Youth Foundation (AYF) Leadership Conference. The application process for this award is through leader recommendations.

Club Financial Summaries & Audits

At the conclusion of each 4-H year, all 4-H clubs and entities are required to submit a financial summary and financial audit to the Extension Office. These are due by November 1. Please read and follow the audit guidelines carefully. Clubs may lose their 4-H status if they fail to submit these forms in a timely manner.

As a reminder, members will not be able to order project materials or re-enroll until their club's financial summary and audit are turned in to the Extension Office. You can find this report at on the State 4-H website under club documents or click the links: State 4-H Website.




